Independence

Have faith in your child. This promotes his independence and strengthens his self-confidence. Everyone wants to be self-effective. The pleasure of one's own skills is an incentive to actively learning and gaining new experiences.

- Give your child small chores. For example:
 - Cleaning the table
 - Getting the milk off the shelf when shopping
- Praise your child for his or her abilities and independence.
